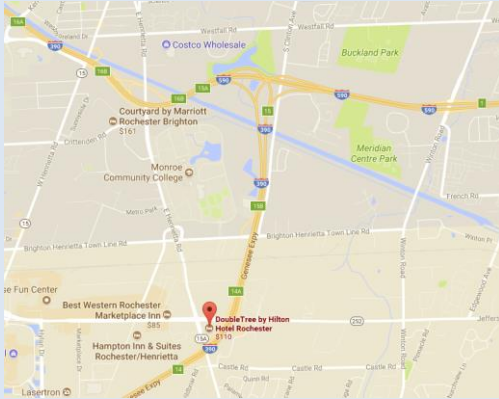

Stephen Munson, M.D. was trained in Pediatrics and General Psychiatry at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at the Philadelphia Child Guidance Clinic/University of Pennsylvania. He joined the faculty of the department of psychiatry at the University of Rochester in 1975 and has been actively engaged in teaching and training medical students and residents in psychiatry and pediatrics ever since. He closed his 40-year private practice of psychiatry treating children, adolescents and families in 2017 but continues his teaching role as Professor Emeritus of Clinical Psychiatry and Pediatrics at the University of Rochester.
